

Country Calendar: December and January

What a year - 2022! It has been given the name "Permacrisis", 77 years since the end of WWII and Europe is again at war. We celebrated Queen Elizabeth's 70 years on the throne, then mourned her loss. A new King Charles and three Prime Ministers in as many months. Excessive heat and a drought, continuing with unseasonable high temperatures into November. The cost-of-living crisis. rising food and fuel prices, fears of a cold harsh winter and energy shortages. Covid still rearing its ugly head and the prediction of a flu epidemic. With a real epidemic of avian flu killing thousands of wild birds and commercial flocks. You could not make this up; it is unbelievable, but we must keep battling on as best as we can. Farmers have to be resilient and optimistic, otherwise you would not bother to get out of bed in a morning. Tomorrow is always another day, having livestock keeps you focused, their welfare being our main priority. Then I read about the tide of illegal meat coming into the UK via Dover. At the start of October, a 24-hour undercover investigation called "Operation Ouzo" checked the adequacy of border controls at the port. Shockingly out of 22 vehicles of Romanian, Moldovan, Ukrainian and Polish origin checked, 21 were found to have large amounts of raw animal produce, despite supposedly increased measures to prevent such illegal meats entering the country. Unfortunately, the outgoing Jacob Rees-Mogg's parting gift was to mothball the UK side checks on such imports, instead allowing shipments to come in unhindered. It is illegal to bring meat products into the country unless they are produced to the EU's commercial standards. Alarmingly these vehicles were found to contain raw animal products loosely stored in carrier bags without temperature control or refrigeration, with no labelled identification, mixed with ready to eat items such as cheese, crisps and cakes, all intended for circulation within the UK. Dover MP Natalie Elphicke has serious concerns, as up to 10,000 vehicles enter the UK at Dover every day. She is quoted as saying "It is clear that the risk of maggoty meat, and meats of unknown origin, which often means horse or other illegal meats rotting due to lack of temperature controls is of real concern. The illegal pork trade is rife at the port of Dover, so rife that around 80% of that illegal trade comes through the short straits without adequate checks; there is nothing to stop it." If the animal health risk is not alarming enough, surely the risk to human health must serve as a wake-up call to UK Government to introduce UK Import Health Certificates on all meat imports immediately. I am horrified to think where this illegal meat ends up, and the fact that a high proportion of these black-market cargos contain illegal meat i.e. horse donkey etc. The risk of diseases such as African swine fever being brought in with such products is much more than a high probability, it is only a

matter of time. What is happening here is criminal: thousands of vehicles arrive unchecked every day. On that particular day the only time any checks were made 21 of the 22 vehicles were found to be ferrying illegal meats; 9978 vehicles went unchecked. Today when no checks are made someone should be held to account! Yet again one has to ask the question - is this Government fit for its office? Never has it been more important to make sure we buy British and local.

It just leaves me to wish you a very Happy Christmas and hoping that what is coming in 2023 is better than what has gone.

Diamond Jubilee Oak in Bourton

I am writing about the young oak tree in the centre of new cemetery field in Bourton. It was found on the bank in the school grounds where a huge oak planted to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee had recently been felled. We kept the tiny sprouting seedling and by the time of our late Queen's Diamond Jubilee it had reached a good metre tall. It was planted out during the four days of village celebrations by Albert Ware, a keen gardener and long term resident, and his granddaughter. To protect it from Gerald Moore's sheep and machinery, Bourton Fencing kindly donated materials and erected an enclosure. Trevor Griffin of village shop fame took it on himself to water and nurture it as he lived opposite.

Ten years on, it is now a splendidly shaped oak tree and to record its history and importance, Jack our 13 year old grandson, has made and carved a plaque using a piece of oak from Stourhead Estate.

Green Fingers: Notes from a Fairweather Gardener December 2022 / January 2023

As I write this, it is pouring with rain and the prospect of going outside for anything at all is most uninviting. This prolonged wet spell should be a reminder to us that the weather can wreak havoc on any garden structures that we may have in place, so on the next fine day, it is worth checking that sheds and greenhouses have remained weatherproof and that fences, pergolas and trellises are secure for the winter. If you have a heated greenhouse, try to ensure that the insulation is as efficient as possible in these times of rising energy costs.

While the plants are dormant in the garden, it is a good opportunity over the next couple of months to prune trees and shrubs, especially those that are prone to bleeding after they have been pruned; it is no longer recommended that pruning cuts are bound because this might encourage fungal growth. Plants that should be pruned before Christmas to minimise bleeding are acers, mulberry and vines. Now is also a good time to prune apple and pear trees that have been grown in open ground, but not wall trained fruit. Most shrub roses can be pruned in January if the weather is mild.

Although it seems that any new growth is impossible in the dark days of January, this is a very good time to start sowing seeds indoors in a warm spot. Many annuals, perennials, vegetables and even exotic indoor foliage plants can be sown in January, and this is an economical way of restocking the garden for the summer. Sow your seeds thinly in a seed tray filled with seed compost and cover them lightly with compost. Sprinkle with water, cover with a fitted plastic cover, a sheet of polythene, glass or even cling film and put in a warm light place. Most seeds will germinate in a couple of weeks, which is very satisfying to watch.

At this time of year, the indoor garden is alive with colourful bulbs and exotica such as poinsettias. We tend to keep our houses rather warmer than most plants would like, so if you want them to last as long as possible, try to find a bright, draught free corner so that you can have the pleasure of them for longer.

Kilmington

At the Parish Council (PC) meeting on 14 November, councillors were informed that the rumble strips and SLOW markings on the B3092 had been installed after a very long wait. These had been installed at the request of the PC in an effort to improve the safety of the junction with Coombe Barn Lane. It was resolved at the meeting to request via the Wiltshire Council Local Highways Footpath Group, that consideration now be given to traffic lights being installed at the junction as both the installation of an acceleration lane or a junction realignment have already been ruled out due to the huge amount of money either of these would cost.

Our Broadband project which is being spearheaded by Cllr Chris Webster has now been stalled due to Wiltshire Council 's signing up to the procurement of Project Gigabit and a full update can be read in the minutes which should be published by the time this magazine is issued. We are slightly more optimistic regarding mobile phone signal strengths in and around the village and work is underway to complete the fibre trunk to the new mast on the Deverells; this should be ready for additional testing in January.

The annual budget for the next financial year was agreed and full details will be given in the next magazine (February) but details will be posted on our website

and on the noticeboard before the end of the year. The next meeting of the PC will be held on Monday 9 January.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my Chairman and Councillors for all their hard work and support over the past year and to wish all readers a very happy Christmas and New Year.

Zeals Almshouses: The Excellence & Inspiration Award

This has been presented by The Almshouse Association to Zeals Almshouse Charity for an outstanding project. A new almshouse has been built using the old Victorian loos behind the Zeals Almshouses. The 4 original cottages each had an outside loo! Latterly used as storage, the trustees realised the space was perfect for a fifth almshouse. A compact eco friendly one bedroom cottage was completed before lockdown. This design along with all the improvements carried out over the past few years on the other cottages comprised updating each one as it became vacant, which included new kitchens, bathrooms, fireproofing, electrics, insulation, and also removing cement from the building and chimneys, repointing with the correct lime rendering. The metal framed windows were removed, sandblasted, repainted and replaced into the original repointed stone mullion frames.

There are 33,000 almshouses throughout the country, so to be recognised and receive this Award is a huge achievement. Zeal Almshouses were shortlisted and then visited by the judges from the Almshouses Association who made the final decision having seen the work and chatted with some of the residents.


